Animal Health Requirements

All goats must have a current Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (Health Papers). All animals are subject to being inspected after arrival at the show facilities and any animals with clinical signs of contagious disease will be sent home. Appropriate Scrapie identification will be required for all animals in accordance with the guidelines provided by USDA Animal Health and Plant Inspection Service. Entries

Entries are open to all 4-H members in the Eastern Region of Tennessee, Southwest District of Virginia, and Western North Carolina counties. Individual goats may only be shown in one division; Dairy or Meat. There is an entry fee of \$5.00 per goat payable to "UT Extension-Sullivan County". Fees may be paid at check-in.

Registration of Name of 4-H members and number and type of goats to be shown should be made by Monday, July 24.

Divisions:

- **Dairy Breeds** (Purebred and Crossbred)
- Meat Breeds (Fullblood & Percentage)

Classes:

- Junior Does (12 months and under)
- Yearling Does (13-24 months)
- Senior Does (25 months and older)
- Junior Bucks (12 months and under) (Specific classes will be determined by age)

Market Wethers (All breeds together) (Specific classes will be determined by weight)

Showmanship Classes will show all breeds together with exhibitor divisions as follows:

- Cloverbuds All Children through 3rd Grade
- Junior 4th & 5th Grades
- Junior High 6th through 8th Grade
- Senior High 9th through 12th Grade

Costume Class

Any Exhibitor, Any Age (K-12), Any Breed -Exhibitor and/or Goat dressed in funny/serious/etc. costume. Winners may be selected at judge's discretion.

Goat Skill-a-thon

Skill-a-thon is a series of learning stations that test the youth's knowledge about areas such as goat breeds, nutrition, anatomy, herd management & diseases. Divisions will be same as showmanship.
